Boulder Reservoir Master Plan Project

Boulder is working through a new Master Plan for the use of the reservoir and adjoining City property including Chandler Field. John Kolberg and I attended a public meeting on the Plan on Monday evening, July 13th on behalf of BAS. As you might imagine, the 50 to 100 people attending the meeting were principally interested the reservoir and water based activities.

After the meeting my feeling was that the Master Plan will probably not affect Chandler Field's or BAS's relationship with the City. While no mention was made of two possible exceptions to that broad statement, it was brought up that the reservoir returns only 80% to 90% of its cost to the City. If the City decides it wants the reservoir to "pay its way", then it wouldn't be surprising if at some point the City seeks additional revenue from new sources. (We haven't been paying anything to the City for use of the property, though we do cover the cost to maintain it.)

While I also did not hear anything that appears to threaten float flying, I plan to attend all meetings open to the public to monitor the situation as closely as possible.
