OUT AND ABOUT

Greg Hine sent in this article and photos after his recent trip to Australia.

Ilse and I just returned from a three week holiday in eastern Australia. During the trip, I had the opportunity to stop by the Coolum, Australia Suncoast Model Flyers RC field (www.coolumflyers.com http://www.coolumflyers.com/). The SCMFers have about 160 members, about half of who are active. They tend to fly Saturday, Sunday with the retired guys coming out Wednesday mornings for flying and a barbeque lunch.

Bruce Carson carsonb@dodo.com.au) tells me the +/- 40 acre field was totally covered with pines, cleared, laser leveled, then seeded with turf. It is the largest, smoothest, best kept RC flying field I have ever seen. While there is a runway marked with white circles at each end, pilots can take off and land in any direction.

In addition to the field, the SCMFers have a "cantina" with stove, refrigerator, tables, open storage shed and more. Probably because Coolum is at 260 south (approximately as close to the equator as Miami), they have a covered set up area perhaps 100' long.

Aussie flyers use the 36 MHz band (not our 72 MHz), and most pilots tend to fly mode 1 (elevator & rudder of the left stick, throttle & aileron on the right).

In addition to the Suncoast's flying field, I happened upon some fantastic slope soaring sites. On Australia's east coast, north of Brisbane and near Coolum and Noosa, just west of Australia's coastal plans, are the Blackall and Glass mountains. The road between Mapleton and Maleny runs along the top of a +/- 1,000' ridge, which in some places is as narrow as the road with steep drop offs on both sides. The ridge and prevailing easterly winds affords many excellent slope soaring sites, some with huge grassy areas running hundreds (thousands?) of yards.
