BAS MEETING MINUTES MAY 12th 2010

Meeting called to order by President Rich Anderson at 6:30PM with 17 members and guest present. Rich asked for a motion to accept last months minutes as they appeared in the last newsletter. Motion by Mark Bradley with a second by Dean Ehn to accept minutes. Motion voted and passed.

TREASURES REPORT--Treasure Dean Ehn gave a detailed report of the clubs finances.

1ST VICE PRESIDENT REPORT--1ST Vice President Augie Bruno was not present. In his absence Rudy Glick reported for him that the club has 2 new members Bill Bancroft and Sarek Lee. This brings the total membership to 100 members.

In order to ensure we maintain our flying agreement with the City of Boulder we have designated a "No Fly Zone" in the northwest section of the field. The no fly zone is northwest of an imaginary line running north from the front of the shelter out beyond the road. If you see planes flying in this area please talk with the pilot because we could lose our flying privileges from the city by violating this requirement.
