REMINDER

John Brink presented a program on aerobatics, also known as pattern flying. He talked about his experience and the many competitions he has been in around the world. John discussed various aerobatic classes: 3D fun fly, FAI pattern class, as well as TOC scale aerobatics. John explained the differences between the planes and various class requirements.

Show & Tell

Boris Sergeev brought an electric plane, which he has modified. Instead of a stock Speed 550 direct drive motor with 6 NiCad cells, he used a 600-size Kyosho Magnetic Mayhem motor with MP Jet 3.33:1 planetary gearbox swinging 12x8 folding prop and powered by 10 NiMH cells. Boris reported 5 minute full-throttle run time and impressive performance of this power system.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Richard A and seconded by Tony K. Motion carried.
